

FATHER DON'S GOSPEL REFLECTION

JN 15:9-17

"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."



We all need a healthy dose of humility from time to time. We need to put our egos in check. This gospel calls us to just such a moment. In this Gospel, Jesus is giving a farewell speech. He knows that His relationship with these friends will soon be changed forever. He is headed to the cross and his friends are going to run and hide until Jesus calls them into the light of salvation.

The amazing intimacy that has been shown to us over the last couple of weeks has shown itself again. How can we not be moved, knowing how deeply we are connected to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit? Jesus is the life-force that continues to nourish us. The Father's love for the Son is overflowing in our hearts. Jesus sought us out. Yes, we can refuse the invitation, but why would we? There is no greater love than laying down one's life for a friend. Can you believe the Son of God is calling us his friends? That is an awesome thing to behold when we finally let it sink in. To be chosen by Jesus to be his very own; what a gift.

If we accept this most precious gift, we are called by name to do something to remain in that loving relationship. We are called to love one another. It doesn't mean we have to be best friends. It doesn't mean we have to spend every waking moment with one another, either. It does mean that we have to find a way to show mercy and compassion to one another. We are called to respect one another and to see Christ in others. We won't be successful at that all the time, either. Because we are not perfect, we will stumble and fall. But that is no reason to give up. Jesus continues to choose us over and over again. He wants a loving relationship with us. He heals our hearts, forgives our mistakes, and supports us when we fail so that we can get up again and continue to lay down our lives for others. When we are filled with the love of Jesus and our heart is full, that is when we must choose to share that love with others. Try a random act of kindness one day next week. Volunteer for a project at work, in the parish or in the community. Pray for those who have done you harm. Pray for those who are sick or shut-in. There are so many ways to show your love for others. When you aren't sure what to do next, turn to Jesus and ask him to show you the way. He is standing right in front of you, reminding you to love one another as he loves you. Deal with it; he has chosen you and wants to be a part of your life. Don't let him down! Walk with him and let him show you the way. Have a great week!!

First Eucharist






