# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 17:11-19

"Jesus said in reply, 'Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?' Then he said to him, 'Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.'"



Jesus had "pity" on the ten lepers; he cleansed them and set them free. Only one of the ten returned, "glorifying God in a loud voice." The Samaritan returned and thanked Jesus for curing him. Jesus said his faith had saved him. What about the other nine? When you think about it, they did exactly what Jesus told them to do. They went and showed themselves to the priests as prescribed by the law. Only the priest could deem a leper clean so that he or she could return to the community. But really now, shouldn't the others have come back to Jesus to say thank you? It just seems like the right thing to do in this situation. After all, they were now free to re-enter society and have a normal life.

Some very good friends of mine gave me a sign that says: "There is always something for which to be thankful." I believe that is so true in my life. Whenever I find myself taking things for granted, I catch the little sign and it reminds me to say thank you to the almighty God. Gratitude is something that we all could use more of in our lives. We take too many things for granted. I think we can easily find ourselves feeling entitled. We can get so bold that we think things are owed to us. When we get that way, it is hard to have a grateful heart. Without a grateful heart, we may find ourselves a long way off from our relationship with Jesus.

If you are like me, which would be very scary, you spend a lot of time petitioning God for things you may need. Maybe you ask for good health of family and friends, for good test results, a new job, a better salary to make ends meet, the list can go on and on. There is nothing wrong with being dependent on the Lord. The Lord is with us in the good of our lives as well as the bad. Sometimes it is all that we can do because the world is so challenging these days. Our prayers of asking can be for worldly things as well; peace, an end to violence, praying for the welfare of immigrants, the unborn, the aging, or equal rights for all. We can feel that we are putting God on overload with our requests. It is ok to be that dependent on God. But sometimes, we need to pause and give thanks to God for listening to our prayers. To be grateful for what has already been given to us. Even if sometimes the answer is "no" when we ask, we should still praise God for the opportunity to have him to turn to with our prayers.

When we realize how much God loves us, we can turn our hearts towards the loving God who cares for us deeply. He, like Jesus in the gospel today, has pity on us. He cares deeply for each of us and will not leave us lost or alone. No matter what is going on in our lives, he has our backs. That is reason enough to thank him. So, take a moment in your busy week to thank God for who you are and what you have been given. Instead of giving a litany of wants, which may be all valid, give a moment of thanks and satisfaction for what you have. Trust that no matter how difficult things may be in your life right now that God is in your midst holding your hand. Thank you, God, for being there. Have a great week! Thank You for who you are; you are special in God's eyes; mine too.
