FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 18:1-8

"Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen one who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you; he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily."

Jesus told a parable about the necessity to pray without becoming weary.

It is an interesting parable about a judge and a widow. The widow simply wore down the judge who feared what the widow might do to him if he didn't give her a favorable judgment. The widow's persistence got her what she wanted. She was not about to give up on her cause. If the judge, who neither feared God nor respected human beings, could render a favorable decision for the widow, imagine what a loving, compassionate God can do for us.

The question we might have to ask of ourselves is, do we pray always? Do we even pray daily? What is our attitude when it comes to prayer? Are we always demanding things from God? These are questions we need to answer when dealing with our relationship with God. We can't have a relationship with God if we don't communicate with God on a regular basis. There has to be a regular time for prayer, and it must happen, at the very least, daily. We have to find a time when it is good for us to spend quality time with the Lord.

For me, I have to begin my day with prayer. I pray the Divine Office first thing, and then I have some other prayers that are significant to me. A couple of times a week, I pray a rosary. Throughout the afternoon I have certain prayers that I pray to remind me that God needs to be the center of my life. I usually have a long list of people to pray for, so I include them in the prayers I offer during the day. When bedtime comes along, I spend some time giving thanks for all the things that came my way during the day. I again spend time praying for those who have asked for my prayers. Still, I could spend more time in prayer; centering on Jesus is essential in my daily routine but there is always more.

I have a sign in my office that reminds me daily about how I should pray. It says, "If you are too busy to pray, you are too busy." When we have a good prayer relationship, it helps to navigate the ups and downs that come our way. When we communicate regularly with God, life seems more simple. When we pray and remain consistent with that prayer, we will see the Lord working in and through us. We must trust that God is with us always. When we call out day and night, he will not let us down. He will see to it that justice is done and done quickly. But we must be sure to be grateful. He always has our best interest in his heart. We must have the faith to believe that.

The last line of today's gospel is one that we should spend some time reflecting on this week. "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" What a challenging thing to drop on us. How will you answer that for yourself? Don't answer too quickly. Pray about how the Son of Man impacts your life. We have a lot of work to do to make the world aware of the Son of Man. We are the Body of Christ and as such, we must grow the body. Let us find ways to be Christ for others. Pray early and pray often, keeping the lines of communication open. Have a great week!
