FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

MK 10:35-45

“You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?” They said to him, ‘We can.’ Jesus said to them, ‘The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized you will be baptized’...When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John.”



James and John wanted to sit on either side of Jesus. They wanted to be the top apostles for Jesus. Jesus made it clear that this was out of the question. But it is interesting to see how the scene unfolded. Jesus wanted to know if they were willing to take the same journey. Could they drink from the same cup and endure the same baptism that Jesus would embrace? How could they possibly say no after making such a request? Of course, they said yes to both demands. Now, enter the other ten apostles. No way they were going to stand for special treatment unless they were part of the special treatment. But did any of them really understand what they were asking about?

No, none of them knew. I wonder, if they knew, would they have been so quick to fight about who sit at the right and left of Jesus? His cup to drink was the drink of his passion and death. He was taking a brutal journey to Jerusalem and to the cross. That baptism he spoke about was embracing his ministry here on earth, the salvation of all. But that could not happen without the journey to Calvary and for him to be arrested by the chief priest, the scribes and elders. Did any of the apostles accept what Jesus had told them repeatedly? No, they did not. Would they eventually accept it? Well, once the story unfolded and they were filled with the Holy Spirit, it finally sank in to their hearts.

But they had a lot to learn about leadership. Jesus had to take them by the hand and teach what it meant to be a true leader. The greatest among them was called to be servant. “Whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all.” How can Jesus say that, telling them they must be slave to all? Well he can, because of what he says later: “For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.” The teacher educated the students. If one wants to be a leader, they must follow this formula. Being number one comes at a cost. The cost is emptying ones’ self for the good of all. Jesus shows, by his life, that the emptying of his life was ransom for all of us. He served the needs of all so that we might all have life: life to the fullest.

But Jesus wanted, and still wants, his students to be teachers by example. They should take what they learned and reach out to others. This too, will cost them their life as well. Becoming a servant can be a very freeing experience. Jesus teaches each of us how a grateful heart is one that is generous to others. Jesus’ unconditional love for each of us allowed him to make the choices he made. Jesus becoming human, for our sake, allows us to embrace salvation. But once we become aware of what Jesus has done for each of us, it becomes our turn. We are called to drink from the same cup and enter into the same baptism that he did. We can say yes because we know what they both mean. We are called to service and to be other-centered. We don’t have a “me and God” thing. We are called far beyond our selfish understanding of God to realize a more communal understanding. We are a kingdom bound, and that is a good thing. But it is a gift. A rare gift that we should always show gratitude to the Father. What have you done for the kingdom lately? Have a great week!

All Souls Day Celebration is a particular day of remembrance set-aside in the church year to remember those who have died. We would like to invite everyone to attend a 7:00 p.m. Mass on Monday evening, Nov. 5 in the main church.



We will remember in a special way those members of our parish family who have died over the past year. We invite these families to be present and carry a candle in remembrance of your loved one to be placed in the sanctuary during the procession. We would also like to remember losses due to still-born, losses of a child at birth or shortly after, young children, and those relatives of parishioners who died over the past year but may not have been members of our parish community. A candle may certainly be placed for them as well. These same names can be listed in our parish Book of Life and in Our Book of the Innocence, which will both be carried in the Processional of the liturgy. For this purpose, we invite you to enter the names of your deceased loved ones in the books. Pages of the Book of Life and Book of the Innocence will be on a table in the Gathering Space a couple of weeks before the Mass.

If you have suffered the loss of a family member, child or special friend this year and would like to take part in this liturgy and have a candle reserved for you to carry in the entrance procession, please call the office at 777-6433 by no later than noon on Monday, Nov. 5 with the name of the loved one who has died.

Note: If you are participating in this liturgy with a candle, we ask that you be present in the Gathering Space by 6:30 p.m. for further instructions.




