# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 18:9-14

"Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. 'Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector.'"

Before we read the parable, it is already set up that the Pharisee would be the one with the inside track and the tax collector would be seen as the sinner, not worthy of God's time. However, the Pharisee opened with his prayer and his ego took over. He became very arrogant and felt above everyone else, especially the tax collector. He was not open to receiving the goodness of the Lord. His heart was a great distance from God. What motivated him was not mercy and compassion but his large ego.


The tax collector had the right attitude towards prayer. He had a deep sense of humility. He knew he wasn't perfect, that he was a sinner. He sought a relationship with God, looking for mercy and compassion. He dared not to even raise his face to heaven; he knew that he was in need of God's love. He couldn't even bring himself to come anywhere near the Pharisee. He knew his place in the temple. He was not there to justify himself, but to seek forgiveness.

Jesus told us that the tax collector was justified in the story. He finishes by saying... "whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." So, what is the attitude that we take to prayer? Are we better than other people and feel the urge to tell God? The Lord knows us better than we know ourselves. The attitude that we must have is one of humility. It is the only way to approach the Father.

Many, many years ago I was part of a group of young adults that did clown ministry. We were giving a retreat and did several parables for the group on retreat. One of the parables was the gospel today. When we decided who was doing what, I was assigned the part of the tax collector. Another gentleman was the Pharisee. He really got into the part and spent time making sure to make himself look good and to make me feel like the low-life in the story. I embraced the notion of humility as the narrator read the parable out loud. It was hard to hear the description of the two people in the story. I felt that I was truly the sinner and had no business looking to heaven for anything but mercy. Of course, at the end the tax collector ended up all right, but it was a powerful lesson I didn't forget.

I think that lately I have found myself being a bit humbler in my prayer life. I realize that I am not the center of the universe and that I am still one who struggles with sin. I seek mercy and compassion from the Lord and do not always make mercy and compassion a part of my life towards others. When I get a little stuck on myself, I know that it is time to turn to the Lord and allow myself to surrender to God.

How about you? How do you approach the Lord, God? What is the attitude you take when it comes time to spend with Him? Does pride get in the way, or can you realize that God is the center of the universe? When we are grateful and appreciate what God has given us, then we can be meek and humble of heart. Don't let pride get in the way of your prayer life. Be humble before the Lord, let him justify you before others. Have a great week!

Nov. 6, 7 - 8:30 in the Chapel


