FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 17:5-10

"The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.'"

Think about that quote for a moment. If we have faith the size of a mustard seed, which is about the size of the period at the end of this sentence, we would be able to uproot trees and plant them somewhere else. That's not something I want on my resume, but it would be amazing to have that kind of faith. However, the apostles didn't feel they had enough; they wanted more. Jesus stated that they had more than enough. So, what is the issue? Why didn't the apostles trust what they had? Better yet, why do we feel we need a larger dose of faith? Why can't we appreciate what God has given to us?

It is hard to accept that we have everything we need to make it in this world. We may worry too much about things that are out of our control. It is at times too easy to blame God for things that go wrong. If he would only give us more, surely that would solve all our problems. It isn't that we don't have faith; it is that we don't seem to know how to put it into action. We want everything handed to us so that we only have to put forth a little bit of effort. God has spoiled us and given us so much, yet we are never satisfied. How arrogant can we be when it comes to taking so much from God and giving so little back in return! We are like the apostles: quick to cry out, wanting more. Like the apostles, we should be happy with what we have. That mustard seed of faith is more than we need. The issue is that we have to trust in the small bit of faith that has been given to us. It really is that simple when you think about it. It helps knowing that God has our back no matter what comes our way. When all else seems to fail, we need to step back and realize that God has been with us through it all. He will not leave us hanging. God loves each of us unconditionally. When things go south, God takes our hands and helps us get up and continue the journey with him. We are never on our own.

Jesus calls us to a sense of humility in the second half of the gospel. We are called to work on building the Body of Christ without looking for a pat on the back. He said rather bluntly: "When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'" It is what a grateful steward is called to do for the Master. One might feel that isn't fair. By our baptisms, we entered into our relationship with the Lord. It called us to be other-centered and not self-centered. We must carry our own weight so that the burden will be light for all. If our faith makes us ready, we must take to the task of proclaiming the Good News in our world. It is important that we show others where Christ dwells in our lives. We are called to be Christ for others in this community. Don't miss the opportunity of being servants who are grateful for the gifts that have been placed in our lives. Have a great week!

All Souls Day is a particular day of remembrance set-aside to remember those who have died. We would like to invite everyone to attend the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, Nov. 2 to pray for your deceased loved ones. We invite these families to be present and carry a candle in remembrance of your loved one to be placed in the sanctuary during the procession. We would also like to remember losses due to still-born, losses of a child at birth or shortly after, young children, and those relatives of parishioners who died over the past year, but may not have been members of our parish community. A candle may certainly be placed for them as well.

- Pinto Beans. 1- or 2-pound bags. Also canned pinto beans. Canned chili beans are acceptable.
- Canned Tomato Products
- Canned Vegetables
- Canned Fruit, Fruit Cocktail
- Canned Tuna / Chicken
- Pasta: Mac & Cheese, Elbow Macaroni, Spaghetti Noodles, Ramen packets
- Canned Soup
- Saltine Crackers (The boxes with 4 sleeves)
- Breakfast items: Instant Oatmeal Packets, Boxed Cereal, Pop Tarts, Pancake mix, dried/evaporated milk

Refrigeration is scarce. The pantry supplements what these families receive from welfare. Please put food items in cardboard boxes no heavier than 20 pounds. God's Gardeners: Fall Cleanup


Saturday, Oct. 19 at 9 a.m. in front of Church
