

FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 21:5-19

“...I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute...You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”



As we near the end of the church year our readings become darker. We begin to talk about signs and wonders that will come before us. There will be wars and natural disasters around the world. It will look very bleak and fear may come over us when we hear about these things. But Jesus warned us, and he said that we are called to remain faithful. We may find ourselves in the midst of persecution. Additionally, those closest to us may be the very ones to turn us in to the authorities.

We are called not to panic. If we remain faithful to the Lord, he will provide all we need to remain faithful through all the turmoil. There will be a calm during all the chaos. Jesus promised that there is nothing to prepare for. He will give us everything we need to say to defend ourselves. There is a chance that in the midst of all that is happening, we will pay the ultimate price because someone doesn't like our view. While it may not cost us our lives, it may cost us family or friends. Standing up for what is right can and does usually cost us something.

Jesus was speaking to a people who would suffer greatly. He spoke about the temple being destroyed and the readers knew that he was speaking the truth. In 70AD the Romans destroyed the temple and those who believed in Jesus were persecuted for their beliefs. These were violent times. The great fear of the unknown was in their hearts. When destruction is all around, it is easy to see how one would worry about the end of the world.

Jesus told us that when the end of the world is coming, there will be little doubt. But when you think about it, all the worrying in the world won't help the situation. If we have our lives rooted in the faith of Jesus and his never-ending love, all things will find their natural place. We must be strong and stay alert. There are enough things that come into our daily lives to challenge us and our faith. But those who persevere, who remain faithful to the calling that Jesus has given them their lives, will be secure. As Jesus says, not a hair on our head will be destroyed.

The question we must ask ourselves is: do we have enough faith to trust the process? Do we really trust that, in the hands of Jesus, we will be all right? Do we feel comfortable in the loving arms of Jesus to care for us and protect us from all the challenges this life will bring? I hope I do, and it seems easy when everything is going well. But there are times when our faith is called into question, especially when things go south. That is when our foundation of faith must be strong. When the core of who we are comes into question and we have to take a stance, will we remember what Jesus said to us in the gospel today?

I believe we will have the courage to remain strong in times of trouble. Jesus calls us to a deeper faith in the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, which is the source of our life. Let us rejoice that we are indeed part of the Body of Christ. Let us become what we receive so that we can be Christ for others.

St. John Church Building Evacuation Information


In an effort to increase our safety during Mass and other church activities, we are publishing the church building floorplan and exit information.

When is an emergency evacuation necessary?

- Whenever the fire alarm sounds;
- If faced with a potentially dangerous situation in the church

What do I do?

- Know your exits! Please note the two closest exits to you when you sit down for Mass or any other church activity. Note that the nearest exit may not always be the safest way to escape. Always have a backup exit in mind.
- Exit in an orderly fashion. Obviously, exiting quickly is important, but do not push or knock over your fellow parishioners. Be safe. Avoid falls and injuries.
- If a quick evacuation is warranted, do not stop to pick up your personal belongings. Leave the building and retrieve them later.
- For a fire event, gather at a safe distance from the building or area, taking care not to block entrances and exits. Emergency personnel will need a clear path into and out of the building or area.
- Report the condition and location of any persons unable to leave the building or area or who need assistance to emergency personnel.
- Wait for the all-clear from emergency personnel before attempting to re-enter the building or area.

Hello fellow parishioners! I am currently finishing up my third week at St. John the Evangelist. It has been such a blessing meeting many of you at Generations of Faith, Confirmation classes, and after Mass on Sunday. I look forward to meeting even more of you in the next couple months. I thought I could share with you all my background and my hopes and dreams for the Youth programs at Saint John!



I was born and raised in Columbus, Ohio as a big buckeye fan. I attended Bishop Ready High School on the West side of Columbus – go silver knights! After realizing my passion for sharing in Christ's life, solidarity with the poor, and for Theology, I decided to pursue a degree in Theology with minors in Peace and Justice Studies and Social Work at Xavier University. St. Nick Toy Drive



Request: Crosses and Crucifixes





Tony Klimek, Justice & Peace Commission

This month, we recognize and thank Tony Klimek for his service to our Justice & Peace Commission. Tony was raised in the Appalachian area of western Pennsylvania where the Catholic Church was closely aligned with unions, the working-class, and the first and second generation immigrants from eastern Europe. Those early years and Catholic social teaching has helped to guide his involvement with the St. John Justice and Peace Commission.

Tony has been a member of our Commission for more than 12 years; the Commission has been active in our church and community and has worked to educate and support a more just society in the Catholic social tradition. The Commission has had educational programs, outreach to urban Catholic Churches in Cincinnati, supported community dinners in West Chester, led electronic recycling programs, established a Little Free Library program, and other activities.

Tony also picked up some wood working skills from his father who was a carpenter; he has helped build and maintain multiple Little Free Libraries to provide neighborhoods with easy access to books. In accordance with the teachings of Pope Francis, participation in society, working together for the common good and the dignity of all human beings; and being good stewards of God's Creation are all parts of Tony's Catholic faith.

Tony and his wife, Jan joined St. John in 1996 when they moved from Pittsburgh with their four children – Michael, Jennifer, David and Sarah. They are now empty nesters and are active with their family, church and community. They enjoy spending time in the great outdoors and admiring the beauty of nature.

Liturgy of the Word with Children

The goal of this ministry is to provide a meaningful and fun experience for Children Grades 1, 2, and 3 during the Liturgy of the Word dismissal at the 9:30 and 11:30 AM Sunday Masses.
