

# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 19:1-10

"And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house because the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost.'"



We hear the story of Zacchaeus in today's gospel. He was a man short in stature and a man not well-liked in Jericho. He was a chief tax collector and therefore was considered to be a sinner. People grumbled when Jesus came to Zacchaeus's house to visit: "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner."

However, Zacchaeus had a moment of clarity and spoke how he would live out his change of heart. He would empty himself of his material wealth and make right the wrongs he had done towards people. He found his soul the day that Jesus came to his house. While others saw Zacchaeus as a sinner, Jesus saw a descendant of Abraham. While many looked down their noses, Jesus raised up Zacchaeus to be a righteous man. Zacchaeus was no longer lost; he found salvation in the person of Jesus. He grew in stature that day in Jericho when Jesus came to his home. What started as a curious man climbing a sycamore tree to see Jesus became a new creation in the gift that Jesus had brought to him.

The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost. I don't know about you, but that makes me very happy. There are many times when I find myself wandering around, feeling lost, in need of someone to find me and bring stability into my life. Once again, I think the gospel is calling each of us to a deep sense of humility. This means that we have to move our ego out of the way and let the humble, vulnerable side of our personalities take over. What would you be willing to do to see Jesus pass by you? Maybe we don't want to come too close to him. Maybe seeing Jesus at a distance is the only way we can accept him. However, this is not good enough for Jesus when it comes to a relationship with us. We must be open to the invitation that Jesus offers each of us. Jesus is saying to us: "...today I must stay at your house." What will our answers be? Will we say yes? What will others say about Jesus coming to our house? After all, we are sinners and Jesus is coming to be with us. Can we afford to be seen with Jesus? Jesus is more than comfortable with us, and we should be, too.

I am ready to surrender to Jesus and accept his invitation. I know that I am not perfect and there are situations in my life where I could use a change of heart. I may not have the same issues that Zacchaeus had as the tax collector, but there are challenges nonetheless. How about you? Can you be humble enough to admit there is a need for a change of heart? Jesus made the call and continues to call each of us until we finally give in and let him into our hearts. It is an awesome feeling knowing that Jesus will not stop looking for us; he will never give up. Salvation can come to our homes if we let Jesus bring it to us. Don't let the material world get in your way. Zacchaeus was a very wealthy man but that meant nothing when he came face to face with Jesus. When the Lord Jesus comes knocking, let him in. You have nothing to lose and everything to gain. Jesus loves each of us and that is Great News. Answer the call and let him in; salvation is waiting. Have a great week!

If you might not have time to roast turkey this year, these sealed, packaged meat slices would be another great way to give.

### Cooking Turkey Instructions:

- Cook turkey; cut all meat off the bone. Wrap white and dark meat together and freeze. Use hard plastic containers such as Cool Whip tubs.
- Please drop off your cooked and frozen turkey as below. Please include your name, address, telephone number, and the date, so we can keep the records current.

Thanksgiving – Bake and deliver to the St. John Parish Office before Monday, Nov. 25

Christmas – Bake and deliver to the St. John Parish Office before Wednesday, Dec. 20, 2018.

## Second Collection Next Weekend

Next weekend, our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS). Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is the only U.S. diocese responsible for providing pastoral care to men and women serving in the U.S. armed forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or working for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - including those from our own parish and diocese. Including families, AMS priests and deacons serve approximately 1.8 million Catholics who hail from 50 states and U.S. territories. While the salaries and retirement of Catholic military chaplains are paid for by the U.S. government, the AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military for program and administrative costs. Nov. 6, 7 - 8:30 in the Chapel


