FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

MT 11:2-11

"Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus said to them in reply, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."



The answer was clearly "Jesus". John had heard things from prison, and he needed to know if his disciples should follow Jesus or wait for another. He got his answer, loud and clear.

Jesus spoke about John the Baptist in the second half of the gospel. He told of the greatness of John because he had finished the work of his mission. He was the messenger that prepared the way for the Lord to come into the world. He challenged those around him to think about what it was that they were looking for in John. Did they realize that John was the ideal prophet, the herald of the Good News, that the Messiah was among them?

However, John had to be sure in his heart that the Messiah was Jesus because he wanted all things in order. I believe that he needed to know that he had completed his mission. Jesus praised John, but even in his words of praise, he spoke of John's humble side: "least in the kingdom is greater than he."

So, it is now up to us to ask the question the disciples asked Jesus. Is he the one we are looking for? Is Jesus the Messiah that has come into the world to bring salvation into our lives? Maybe we might look at the things that Jesus used as examples to show how he is the Anointed One. What do we hear and see in our lives that reveal Jesus among us? We may not see the miracles that Jesus performed so many years ago, but can we see the little things that Jesus does within our lives?

Perhaps if we narrow our view on the world of sin, we can find answers. How often have we been blinded to sin and Jesus opened our eyes to see the wrong and be forgiven? How often has sin paralyzed us so that we couldn't walk, and Jesus healed us and made us whole? So many of us are scarred with sinful behavior and Jesus cleansed it all away.

The world is so loud. How often have we had trouble hearing the word of Jesus? Jesus comes to us and makes us hear once again the good news; he cures our deafness. Reconciliation is a wonderful gift that raises us from the deafness that sin can cause. It thrusts us into the everlasting grace of God's unconditional love. Lastly, how many of us are poor in spirit? How many of us are hungry for something in our lives to bring us back into the loving arms of Jesus? All we must do is turn to the Lord and allow him to speak to our hearts. It is never too late to find the goodness of Jesus and his salvation message.

In preparation for the Christmas season, it might be a good thing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our parish service will be this Monday evening, December 16. It will begin at 7:00 p.m. and there will be seven priests to help in the healing process of the sacrament. What a great way to ready oneself for the coming of Jesus in this Christmas season. In all the rush of this time of the year, take time to truly prepare for the coming of our Savior. Have a great week!

Jan. 13, 7 - 8:30 p.m.







In 1998 at the age of 45 I thought my life was over when my husband passed away suddenly from pancreatic cancer. You see, it was the 2nd time I was forced to face the death of a husband as my 1st husband had also passed away at a very young age.

My faith in God was tested and I was so lost and confused. I felt God had abandoned me and I didn't know where to turn or who to talk to about my feelings. Following years of struggling with my loss and separation from the church I had grown up with and loved, I found myself with a feeling that I would never find peace in my heart. I did find peace, but I often wonder how things might have been different if I asked for help sooner.

Since that time I have constantly searched for ways to help others who are struggling both emotionally and in their faith. So when I heard about Stephen Ministries and the great work they do to help other parishioners at St. John, I knew I had found a new purpose that God had lovingly put in my path.

I joined Stephen Ministries approximately three years ago and learned so much about servitude and myself through the excellent training I received. As a Stephen Minister, I am humbled and honored to help others through their grief and struggles by being there to listen and support them. All of the Stephen Ministers at St. John are people who truly care about others and are always ready and eager to serve. I'm proud to be a part of such an amazing group of caregivers!

If I had known about this wonderful ministry when I was going through my toughest time, I wouldn't have hesitated to ask for help from a Stephen Minister. Christmas – Bake and deliver to the St. John Parish Office before Wednesday, Dec. 18, 2019


