

FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

MT 3:13-17



“...he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, ‘This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.’”

Jesus came to the Jordan to be baptized by John. John tried to talk Jesus out of the baptism, but Jesus insisted that it take place. The question is, why? Why would Jesus come to receive the baptism that John was performing? It was a baptism that called for the person to renounce their sins and change their heart. Jesus surely did not need any sins to be removed and his heart was pure. However, Jesus said in reply to John’s questioning: “Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness.” It was part of the Father’s master plan for salvation and Jesus is the fulfillment of that plan.

Jesus was embraced by both the Spirit who descended upon him and the Father’s words announcing his pleasure. In one way, this is an endorsement of Jesus and a commissioning into his mission to do the will of the Father. It is both an ending and a beginning. For John, his mission was complete. He made straight the path of the Lord. He prepared, as best as he could, the people for the coming of the Christ. As Jesus rose out of the river Jordan, his mission began. He was anointed by the Spirit of God and the Father blessed him as well. What a scene that must have been for the people of the Jordan to witness. How amazing it would have been to be there and witness the Good News about the Son of God. It would be a baptism they would not soon forget.

On this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can all look to what took place at our baptisms. We were brought into the family of God through the waters. As the water was poured or we were immersed into the water, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit washed over us. We were freed of our original sin, but even more importantly, we were brought into the family of God. It was to fulfill all righteousness. We entered the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. While it was a one-time event, it is something that we are called to daily. Our “yes” to the baptismal promises are ones we should often respond to in our lives. Every time we bless ourselves with holy water and make the sign of the cross, we are calling to mind what took place in our baptisms. It calls us to the relationship we have with Jesus and the Good News we are all called to proclaim. Each and every day of our lives, we should say “yes” to the Good News that Jesus gave us.

What took place with Jesus at the Jordan River is something that happens to us today in our Sacraments of Initiation. The Holy Spirit comes to us in a profound way in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation completes the Sacraments of Initiation, which began with the waters of baptism. That is why it is so powerful for me when we see adults come into the church and receive their baptism, confirmation and Eucharist all at one liturgy. The true Easter joy comes from that rich moment in their sacramental life. But no matter when we enter the initiation sacraments, we all long to hear what Jesus heard when he came out of the water: “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” God is indeed pleased with us when we follow his will. May we say yes to the Lord on this feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Have a great week!


