# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

MT 5:17-37

"If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body thrown into Gehenna. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body go into Gehenna."

It is a good thing that Jesus is not speaking literally with these words. I don't know about you, but I would have some serious problems functioning in the world if I did take Jesus literally. But Jesus calls us to take a hard look at our lives in today's Gospel reading. He asks us to examine just who we are in relation to the world we live in. How do we respond to the commandments that are set before us? Jesus tells us that, "unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." Do we measure up to that challenge? Or are we people that say all the right things, but our actions don't reflect what we have said.

In Matthew's chapters five to seven we have the Sermon on the Mount. It is Jesus at his best giving us a moral compass to use in our daily lives. It is the Good News for salvation. While it is the Good News it is not easy news. It is something that we must invest a lot of energy into, and takes a lot of our time. It is more than what we do when we come to church on Sunday. The Eucharist is something to begin our week with, but it must continue beyond the Sunday liturgy.

We must examine our lives and see if we measure up to the high standard that Jesus has placed before us. It really, in many ways, calls us to have a change of heart. It calls us to look at how we treat others around us. It challenges us to let go of things that keep us from a right relationship with God. If we don't know how to treat one another with love and respect, how in world can we say that we love and respect God? It is only when we see Christ in others that we can truly understand how to love God. When we fail to understand this, we fail to fully embrace the Good News.

Our faith is not something that we can merely phone in. It is not a giant check list that we can keep and once it is finished heaven is ours. Jesus' message to us today is that it must be a life choice to embrace the Good News; a way of life that becomes a true part of us. It is doing the will of the Father and being other-centered in our lives. For me, I know I must be better at it. There are many things that have to be cut out of my life to be a better Christian. There can be no off switch for me when it comes to fulfilling the will of the Father. But I know if I embrace the gospel message with all my heart, I can be a better disciple.

So, we all need to take a look at ourselves to see what things might need to be changed. For some it may be a minor flaw that can be corrected. For others it may be a more dramatic change of heart. The good thing is that when we identify what we need to change, Jesus will be there to give us the strength to grow through the challenge. I believe it is worth the effort. How about you? Do you truly want to grow as part of the Body of Christ? Have a great week!

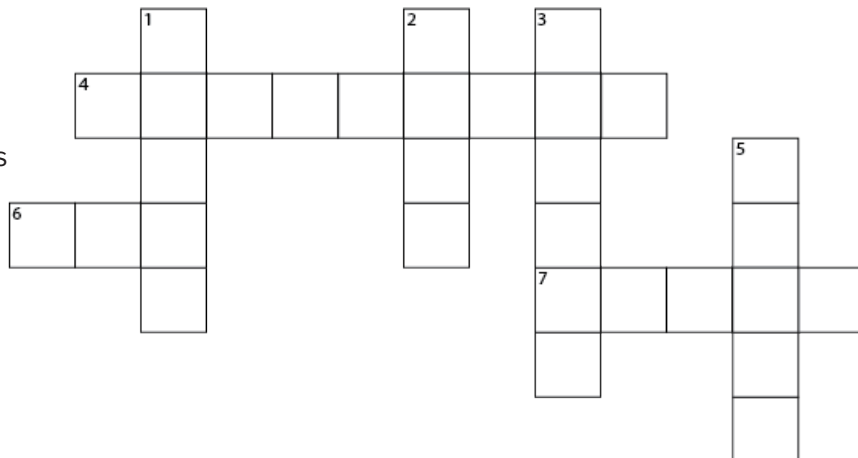
