FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 2:22-40

"...Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted-and you yourself a sword will pierce-so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.'"

In my office a painting of the Presentation of the Lord by Rembrandt. It is a beautiful picture that shows the mother Mary and the child Jesus in her lap and Simeon in front of them blessing the family. The lighting used almost looks like Rembrandt had shown a spotlight on the whole scene. The colors are so striking in this simple painting. Today we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. It is a time when Mary and Joseph went to the temple to offer sacrifice to the Lord and present Jesus to Him as dictated by the Law of Moses. Simeon is a righteous man who has long waited for this moment in time. He knew he would not die until this encounter took place. Simeon's message is one that is full of mystery.

I can't imagine how this message was received by Mary and Joseph. Here is their child, their son, being talked about with such lofty musings. He is one who will bring sadness to Mary for Simeon says a sword shall pierce her heart. But at the same time, he shall reveal the hearts of many. He will bring people to a point in their lives that they will have to make a choice, to accept or reject his message. I would think that Mary and Joseph would reflect back upon all this amazing information as the child grew in wisdom and age.

There too, in the temple was a prophetess, Anna, who gave thanks to God for the opportunity to see this child. She spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. Jesus was the source of salvation, in the eyes of Anna. She was given the gift to recognize the child Jesus as the one who the world was waiting for.

Wouldn't you like to have been with the family as they traveled back to Nazareth? And to be in on the conversation with Mary and Joseph about what was said about their child, Jesus? Parents have been known to brag about their children from time to time. Mary and Joseph could have taken bragging to a new level. What proud parents they must have been returning from the temple. But I am sure Mary was concerned about the words about a sword piercing her heart. No parents would want to hear such things predicted for them. But many parents, like Mary, have swords piercing their hearts. What Mary will endure as the mother of Jesus will bring a mixture of sadness and joy. When all is said and done, the joy of her son's death and resurrection will bring redemption for all.

So, we can see today that Simeon and Anna were right in their predictions of this child, Jesus. Looking from the outside in, can we see who Jesus is and what he has meant to each of us? The child grew in wisdom and the favor of God remained upon him. Simeon and Anna could die peacefully for they saw what we now know is true. Jesus came to bring salvation to the world. But not everyone will see Jesus for who he really is - the savior of the world. We too have seen the Christ of the Lord as Simeon did in the temple. Only, we recognize him in the breaking of the bread, as the Body of Christ. Let us rejoice and be glad that our savior has come to us. Go announce to the world the Good News. Have a great week!




