# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 4:5-42

“When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, ‘We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world.’”

Isn't that the way good evangelism should work? The seed was planted in the woman at the well, a Samaritan. Jesus nourished that seed into something that grew in the woman. She in turn took what she had growing in her heart to the townspeople. Through their invitation to Jesus, salvation came to their town. In two days, people were now convinced in their own hearts who Jesus was and what he meant to them. Jesus planted the seed in the woman at the well and she in turn planted the seed of knowledge into the people who gathered to listen to her. But in both cases, it was Jesus who watered and nourished the seeds into an understanding that He was the savior of the world.

Jesus revealed himself to the woman at the well. But it did not come instantly. She had to grow in her understanding of who was speaking to her. At first, she thought he was just a foolish man – a mere Jew - coming to the well to draw water without a bucket. Then as they continued to talk, she saw him a prophet because he knew of her life. Finally, she saw him as the Messiah. I think it is interesting that she left her bucket at the well. I believe she had been filled with the living water that Jesus offered to her. Her thirst was quenched. Jesus had peeled the layers of her life away and revealed someone who needed to be filled with the Good News.

Jesus has looked at every one of us. He knows everything that we have done. And despite shortcomings, he still wants to offer us the living water, so we no longer thirst. The question is, are we willing to come to the well to be filled with that water? We don't need to bring our bucket, for Jesus is the source of life that we are longing for. But many of us still hold on to that bucket, for we fear that the well is deep, and we may not trust Jesus to care for us and quench that thirst.

If we feel a little bit of hesitation, we might need to open our hearts up to trust that Jesus is enough to fill us with his life. We don't need to fear that he will let us down. When we see the good things in the world, we realize that God is ever present and ready to come to us. We must humble ourselves and be open to see what Jesus has to offer each of us. He is more than a prophet; he is the savior of the world. When we accept this, then and only then will our thirst be satisfied. But when it is satisfied, we are called to be proclaimers of the Good News. We are called to be his disciples. The woman at the well gave the good news to the people who knew her well. Let us do the same in our community. We have a mission and the rewards are amazing. Jesus is the Messiah, the one to come, the savior of the world. What an amazing gift Jesus is to us. 
