FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

"Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking to you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshipped him.

We have another story about a transformation of an unnamed person. This time we hear about the man born blind. The apostles want to know whose sin it was that caused his blindness. Jesus tells them that neither the parents nor the blind man had sinned, but "it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him." Through the whole story, we see the man grow in his understanding of who it is that brings him his sight.

The man goes toe to toe with the Pharisees and wins the battle in my opinion. The Pharisees do not even want to believe that the man was born blind. Of course, they are also upset that Jesus cured the man on the Sabbath. The question is who is really blind in the story? The apostles don't understand what is going on. The parents of the blind man don't want any part of the situation and, lastly, the Pharisees say to Jesus, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" Jesus puts them in their place by saying, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains." Even the bystanders want to deny who the blind man is. But Jesus knows who he is and comes to him to make sure that the blind man understands who Jesus is. The man comes to believe when Jesus reveals himself as the Son of Man. And the man worshipped him calling Jesus Lord.

I have pretty good eyesight, when I wear my glasses. I am not very good without my glasses on. But I have been blinded many times in my life. I don't mean blind with my eyes - I mean blind as to seeing the Lord clearly in my life. I don't know about you, but there are times when I have a lot of Pharisee in me. I am so blind to see the goodness in people around me that it can be scary. I become jealous of others' good fortune. Knowing that God is alive in others is great news, but sometimes it just seems that some people have all the luck. Then I feel the Lord come to me and open my eyes and see that I was being judgmental and that is no way to live. It is good to have the Lord come to you and take the care, as he did with the blind man, and lead us to the water that clears our eyesight. What a powerful image the healing of the blind man is. And the Lord wants to do the same for each of us.

Jesus said, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Are we humble enough to admit that we are sometimes blind? Can we call for the Lord to heal us? It is never too late to admit that we are in need of getting our eyesight back. During this Lenten season, make time to turn to the Lord to be healed. Let us be like the blind man and say to the Lord, "I do believe." Have a great week!

CORONAVIRUS NOVENA

This is a novena provided by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati asking for the intercession of several saints to come to our aid in the current global crisis. Follow the daily prayers below with the Memorare, St. Michael's Prayer and a Glory Be.

Day 1: St. Anthony the Great

Gracious father, we come before you today asking for your aid in the present crisis. Be with all those who have the coronavirus, both in our nation and abroad. We ask that all those who have contracted the virus would be able to receive appropriate medical attention and recover. St. Anthony the great, patron saint of those afflicted with infectious diseases, pray for us.

Day 2: St. Edmund the Martyr

Gracious father, we come before you today asking that the coronavirus pandemic would quickly and swiftly end. We ask that this pandemic would end in a way that would only be attributed to your divine intervention and mercy. St. Edmund the martyr, patron saint of the victims of pandemics, pray for us.

Day 3: St. Guirinus of Neuss

Gracious father, we come before you today asking for a miraculous in to the present coronavirus crisis. We ask that these miracles will bring more souls to you. St. Quirinus, patron saint of those affected by bubonic plague, pray for us.

Day 4: St. Luke

St. Joseph, patron saint of the universal church, pray for us.

Day 7: St. Matthew

Day 8: St. Raphael

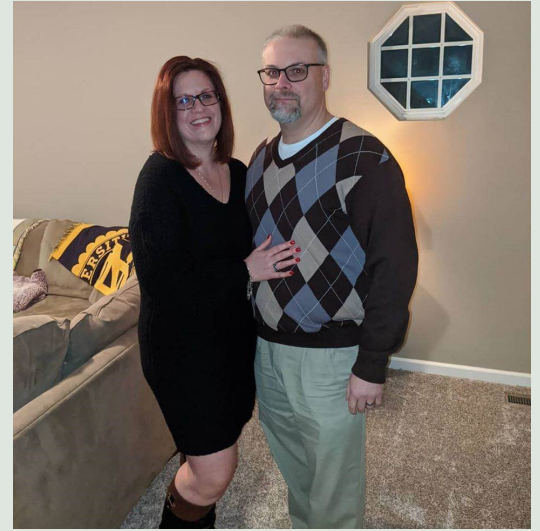
We focus this section of the bulletin on those who are important parts of our community: those who volunteer their time and talents to making our St. John community the collective Body of Christ.

This year's parish festival will be on August 7-8-9. But, before that weekend happens, our Festival Committee spends time on so many activities. We decide on the layout, games, food and beverages. We configure electrical lines, order prizes; determine how many booths and tents and grills we need. We advertise, set up a volunteer website, go shopping for baskets and find sponsors and donors. The list is pretty endless. Luckily we also have a team of about 20-25 people who make this all happen as seamlessly as possible. I am honored and privileged to work side by side with this group of people.

As many of you know, when you give of your time and talent, the rewards that you receive are greater than the time and energy that you give. And, as exhausted as we are on Sunday night at 9pm on the first full weekend in August, we get up and do it again each year. Why? Because we love it and also because we know how much it means to our parish. A full 10% of our parish income comes from these three days each August. Last year, we earned \$160,000 in net income from our festival. That is an amazing feat accomplished by an even more amazing team of people.

If you are interested in serving on our festival committee, we have several positions open this year: Prizes Co-Chair, Basket Co-Chair, Grounds Co-Chair, Entertainment Co-Chair.
