

FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 20:19-31

"But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.'"



I think I'm like Thomas. There are days when I feel like I would really like to see those nail marks, up close and personal. Who am I kidding? I would love to see the risen Jesus stop by our newly renovated offices for a visit. I think we all need reassurance about Jesus' presence in our lives. But don't expect a real, drop-in visit from the risen Lord; I'm not holding out a lot of hope for that.

"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." This is what Jesus told Thomas after his answer of, "My Lord and my God!" Do you think you are among the ones who have not seen and still believed? It depends. I believe we are called to see Jesus in one another. We are called to recognize that we are all part of the body of Christ. We see the true presence of the risen Jesus in the Eucharist each time we have the opportunity to celebrate Mass.

You may say that Mass is different than seeing Jesus come into the locked room and calling Thomas to stop his doubting. I am sure it would be wonderful to have a one-on-one visit with Jesus. But there is one thing that I think Jesus does for us as he did for Thomas: Jesus meets us where we are. He wants to take all doubts and fears out of our lives. He wants each of us to stop our unbelieving. Jesus will move heaven and hell for us to come into a solid relationship with him. While others may try to show us the way to Jesus, it doesn't happen until we come face to face with him. It happens when Jesus comes to meet us where we are and he calms our fears. It is only then when he truly reveals himself to us.

How does this kind of relationship happen? Well, it can be in the privacy of daily prayer when we focus on the gift of Jesus in our lives. It can also happen in the breaking of the bread and the blessing of the cup. Jesus is revealed in the simple gifts we lift up in the Eucharist. Jesus can be seen in each stranger who passes us in our busy lives. He can be seen in the kind words of encouragement of a good friend. There are so many ways that Jesus reveals himself. However, if we fail to see him in these ways, he won't give up on us. He will continue to break into our lives because he loves us more than we will ever know. We are that important to him. He longs for us to cry out, "My Lord and My God!" No locked doors will keep Jesus from us.

Be open to the good news and allow him to bring you into his loving arms. For when we recognize him, then we have come home to him. He puts his arms around us and continues to walk with us. Communion with us is what Jesus longs for. For once we have recognized Jesus as present in our lives, we can see him everywhere. We can't help revealing him to others, either. We can take people by the hands and allow them to touch the face of Jesus through the love of others. Put away your doubt and put your faith in the risen Jesus. Have great week!

Festival Committee Update



Donors! One of the keys to the success of our festival is the number of donors we have. Parishioners, community members, local businesses and even

some of our ministries donate goods, services, gift cards and cash to the festival!

Community businesses donate items that they sell or services that they offer. They also pay for our festival booths by sponsoring them. A sponsorship costs \$150, \$250 or \$500 and the sponsor gets to put their business name on one of our booths. We typically have around \$10,000 in sponsorships! The goods, services and gift cards that are donated go into our basket bonanza or the bid-n-buy area. If you have a business and want to be involved in our festival this year, call our office. We can point you in the right direction.

Parishioners donate to our festival in more ways than I can even describe. Dozens of people help us by buying goods for the basket bonanza, donating quality items to our bid and buy or giving money for us to purchase things for these areas. Some of our ministries get involved as well. For example, our Pastoral Council has purchased the grill for the basket bonanza for over ten years. We have anonymous donors who buy items for numerous baskets! There are so many donors that give behind the scenes. It is difficult to thank them all.

Mary in the Old Testament

May 1, from 9:00 – 10:15 a.m. in the Chapel



Prophecy and prefigurations of Mary can be found throughout the Hebrew Scriptures. Understand the New Testament better in light of the Old Testament, as the Church Fathers did. Dr. Gloria Falcao Dodd is the Director of Academic Programs at the International Marian Research Institute, University of Dayton, OH. She teaches graduate courses in Mariology at the University of Dayton. Dr. Dodd holds a B.A. in theology from Christendom College, an M.Div. and S.T.L. from the Dominican House of Studies, and a Doctorate of Sacred Theology from the International Marian Research Institute. This program will be streamed online so it can be viewed at home live or later from our archives.



The celebration of the Healing Mass consists especially in the laying on of hands by our pastor, Fr. Don, the offering of the prayer of faithful, and the anointing of the sick with oil made holy by God's blessing. This sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against his or her anxiety.




Hearing Devices Available
