# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 10:27-30

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me...No one can take them out of my hand...The Father and I are one."



How good is your hearing? In a world with so many voices around us, how do we listen? We must remain focused in the world that we live in right now. There are so many distractions around us that want to lead us away from the Good Shepherd. However, the beauty of our relationship with Jesus, our Shepherd, is that he never stops calling us. His voice is strong enough to break through and touch our hearts.

There is something special that Jesus spoke about in today's reading. We have been given to the Son by the Father himself. And once the bond between the Father and the Son is forged, there is nothing stronger in the world. Once we belong to the Son, there is nothing that can draw us away or remove us from the hands of Jesus.

That is something that is simple to state, but it is a challenge to accept. I tend to feel a sense of unworthiness. How can I receive the communion of the Father and the Son? There is no way I deserve that gift and I know I have not earned it. That is the beginning of how I can make sense of it all. It is A gift! It's something that our merciful, compassionate, loving God has offered to you and me. It calls for a humble and contrite heart to accept such a gift. To know that Jesus has got us covered is a special thing. We are gifted with a Shepherd that will not let anything happen to us. If we remain faithful and grateful to the gift that is placed in our lives, we will have eternal life.

That should make us overjoyed and excited beyond our wildest dreams. Sometimes, though, we don't respond that way. Why? Why does doubt fill our hearts? What holds us back from such a gift? For me, it begins with listening to too many voices around me. People put me down or show me things that are not Christ-centered. Sometimes I feel unworthy or I allow my ego to get in the way. I do not always allow myself to be humble enough to accept the gift that is given to me. Humility is not a bad thing and I am learning about that all the time. It's important to remember to surrender to the will of the Father through the gift of the Son. When I do surrender, I feel secure in the hands of Jesus who truly loves me for who I am, a child of God. When I let that take place in my life, I feel a true sense of gratitude.

I want to give thanks to God for the gift of eternal salvation. Knowing that I will not perish if I remain faithful to the gift that the Shepherd has given is a comforting thing. When I am still and quiet, I do hear the voice of the Good Shepherd calling me into his loving arms. How about you? Can you be still and listen to the Lord calling you into his loving arms? Can you feel the unconditional love that he has for each of us? Are you ready to show your gratitude for such a marvelous gift? We might not always get it right the first time, but that is okay because Jesus' voice never stops calling us. He is right in front of you calling now; answer him and follow him. Have a great week!





## Healing Mass

May 14, 7 p.m. in Church

Jesus showed great concern for the bodily and spiritual welfare of the sick and commanded his disciples to do

likewise. This is clear from the gospels and especially from the existence of the sacrament of anointing. As Jesus' disciples, we gather in a special celebration, the Healing Mass, to help people find healing in whatever areas they may require it. The celebration of the Healing Mass consists especially in the laying on of hands by our pastor, Fr. Don, the offering of the prayer of faithful, and the anointing of the sick with oil made holy by God's blessing. This sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against his or her anxiety.



## Baptism Preparation

At least one of the parents or legal guardians of the child to be baptized is required to attend our Baptism Formation class. Ideally, both parents or legal guardians are present for the class. It need only be taken once. In addition to the class, a baptism form must be completed. Baptism forms are available at the Baptism Formation class. If you have already taken the class, you can obtain the baptism forms at the church office. Classes are normally held on the third Monday of each month at 7:30 p.m. in the Chapel. Except in the case of an emergency, baptisms are not scheduled during the Lenten season. If you have questions, please call the Parish Office at 777-6433.


