

# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 13:31-33A, 34-35

"I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."



A new commandment was given after Judas had left the Last Supper. This commandment was one that Jesus left for his disciples. It was clear that Jesus was leaving. His mission here on earth was coming to an end. He showed them how to love one another; now it was their turn to live out this new commandment.

Doesn't it sound so simple when you read the words? It seems so easy, but it can be one of the toughest commandments to honor. It takes a special kind of gift to be able to love one another. Just look around the world; how well do we really love one another? There is so much violence and hatred in the world today. Senseless killings, hate crimes, and a true lack of respect for others can be seen everywhere. The headlines in the news speak more about a lack of love for others than an abundance of it.

Jesus gave a commandment that challenges the very core of who we are. I don't think that Jesus gave us the commandment because it was something easy to do. It is a commandment that defines what it takes to be a disciple of Jesus. We have been blessed with His love. He has placed it in our hearts. It is alive in each of us, providing that we recognize it and allow it to make us alive. Jesus's example of love is real, and all-encompassing; it is more than just romantic love that needs to be displayed. It is a love that shows itself in the ordinary, everyday occurrences of our lives.

How do we treat the people who come into our lives? Are our lives so full that we don't truly see these people? Maybe Jesus is passing us by and we don't even recognize him. Do we spend so much time judging others that we can't see the goodness in them? Are we self-made people in love with a creator who is not God?

We need to clean house. We must remove all the clutter that hides our hearts away from the world in which we live in. If we take the time to remove all the obstacles in our life, we can see the path to living out the commandment that Jesus gave to each of us. Loving one another means we must see each other as a member of the Body of Christ. We must look past the petty things that stand in our way to see clearly another human being who is a child of God just like we are. Stop judging and we won't be judged. Start loving and see what good comes into the world around you.

It takes work to be a disciple of Jesus but it's worth the effort. It is a bond that can't be broken if we remain strong in our conviction to live out this commandment that Jesus gave us. While Jesus is not present physically, Jesus is dwelling among us, living inside each of us. The Eucharist is the source of life. The Eucharist is the source of love. Take the gift that has been placed into your hands and make it alive in your daily lives. Be active in living the Gospel message and find ways to be Christ for others. Love one another. Have a great week!






