FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 21:1-19

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus said to him a third time, "Do You love me?" "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." "Feed my sheep...Tend my sheep...Feed my sheep," is Jesus' response to Peter.



How quickly Peter forgot about that night when he denied Jesus three times. That night, he wept bitterly and regretted what he had said and done. In today's gospel, Jesus spoke with Peter while the others looked on. I imagine that Jesus and Peter's eyes locked onto one another. Perhaps there was a nervous energy in the conversation. Maybe you can even sense the frustration grow each time Jesus asked Peter the same question. I mean, Peter was right; Jesus does know everything, so he knew the heart of Peter.

The commands are ones of mission. As leader of the Church, the rock on who Jesus has built the foundation, Peter was asked to care for the sheep of Jesus' flock. It's an overwhelming task to put onto Peter. However, Jesus knew the heart of Peter and he knew that with the gift of the Spirit, Peter could handle the responsibility. At the moment in this gospel, though, Peter was hurt. Jesus asked him the same question three times. However, Jesus is compassionate; I am sure his true intentions were visible.

I have loved this reading ever since I did my clinicals at Children's Hospital. It was an intense summer of working at Children's as a chaplain in-training. When the fall came, we had to write a reflection on the time that we spent training at the hospital. This reading is one that kept coming back to me repeatedly during that summer. I had just lost my sister to cancer that winter. I had 10 patients during that summer die from one thing or another. Sometimes, my emotions were overpowering my life. However, I read this passage over and over again. I always saw a loving savior asking me the questions he asked Peter. Sometimes, I would become upset, but most times I answered with conviction because I felt the love of Jesus through the questions. I knew this was the passage that would begin my summer reflection. A great peace came over me as I wrote about the summer. While parts of the story were painful, I solaced in the fact that death is not the end of life, but it is the beginning of life eternal. I felt so confident talking to my advisor about the reflection paper. In many ways, it brought us closer. It was one of the most powerful summers I have spent in my ministry. I learned things about myself that I had not known before. So, as I read this again, I am reminded of that summer long ago.

So, there you are standing before the Lord. He draws you to himself and perhaps he invites you to sit down for a conversation. Your eyes lock on each other and he asks you the question he spoke to Peter: "Do you love me?" Before you answer, think a moment. Are you ready to respond to what Jesus is going to ask you to do? Are you willing to open your heart up so he can see that your heart and the words you speak are the same? Can you take care of his sheep? Then say it: "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Once you have said yes, your life is forever changed. Jesus will take you places you may not want to go. But in your travels, he will not let you journey alone. He will be with you always. From time to time, he may ask you again if you love him; don't hesitate with your answer. It is an answer that will set you free. Jesus is calling out to you. "Follow me." You know what you must do. Have a great week!



As Jesus' disciples, we gather in a special celebration, the Healing Mass, to help people find healing in whatever areas they may require it. The celebration of the Healing Mass consists especially in the laying on of hands by our pastor, Fr. Don, the offering of the prayer of faithful, and the anointing of the sick with oil made holy by God's blessing. This sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against his or her anxiety.


