

# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 9:11B-17

"He said to them, 'Give them some food yourselves.' ...taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied."

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This is, to me, an awesome feast to celebrate. The Eucharist is at the center of liturgical life. I never miss an opportunity to preach about it. It is not only food for the journey; the Eucharist is an opportunity for us to become more of what we receive.



"Give them some food yourselves." The apostles must have thought Jesus had been out in the sun too long. How could they possibly feed over 5000 people? Five loaves and two fish? You have to be kidding! That would never be enough. But it was enough for Jesus. He blessed them, broke them, and gave them to the people hungry for the gift of Jesus. The gospel said that they ate and were satisfied. From the five loaves and two fish, there were 12 wicker baskets of fragments left. They were filled with the teachings of Jesus and filled with the nourishment of food. Jesus always offers more than we seek.

The feeding of the 5000 with the loaves and fish has an important Eucharistic meaning. We all should be hungry for the bread of life. Just as all in the gospel reading were satisfied with the gift that Jesus gave them, there is a command that goes with that for us. Jesus told the apostles to give the crowd some food themselves. He tells us to do the same. We are to feed one another with the Body and Blood of Christ. Because we are Eucharistic people, we must become Christ for others. We are the Body of Christ.

This is the theme for the next year: "We are the Body of Christ." It is who we are as a church. It is who we are as a faith community. It is who we are called to be as Christians. All that we do should be about building up the Body of Christ. Jesus calls us to be a part of his Body. Everyone is equal in the eyes of God when it comes to being a part of this Body of Christ. No one is more important or less important than the next person. In this communion, we should be drawn closer to the invitation to be a member of the Body. Every time we come to the altar to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we grow closer to the Lord Jesus. When we open our hearts to invite Jesus into our lives, we become a tabernacle, a place sacred unto itself. But we must be sure that it is not just a "God and me" relationship. The Eucharist is bigger than that.

The Body of Christ encompasses all those who are welcomed to the altar of sacrifice. We should be humbled by the call to the Eucharist. In that moment of humility, we enter into the glory of Jesus. When we stand before the altar to seek the power of the Father sending the Holy Spirit to the gifts offered of bread and wine, we become the Body of Christ in a most profound way. We must never take the Eucharist for granted. It is our life-source for salvation. Because of this gift, we also become the Body of Christ. Go out and call others into the Body so we may grow stronger in the love of the Lord. Have a great week!

Sharon, we are so thankful for the hard work that you've put in over your years here at St. John - you will be dearly missed! Enjoy your retirement!




## St. Leo Culture Fest

## PSR Catechist Jody Googins Shares How She Has Been Called

Like all parents, I struggle with time! It is hard to find the time to volunteer outside of the obligations at my children's schools, my job, and other odds and ends. Being a catechist created an opportunity for me to serve St. John while also addressing the spiritual needs of my own children. I am a teacher, and I believe that we should use our gifts for good. Being a catechist allows me to use my skills in teaching, serve the Church, and have my children there as well.



I think some people are reluctant to become a catechist because they think they might not be a good teacher, or they might feel like they do not remember all that they once knew about the Church, the Bible, and its teachings. There is a sense of insecurity about having to teach children when one is not confident in her own knowledge. But - I would say that there is no pressure to be some sort of biblical scholar, or to be an expert on Catholicism. We are all practicing Catholics and have the foundation of our Church's teachings. I have always felt very supported when being a catechist and have felt comfortable asking for help or clarification on content that I am not as confident in. No-one is judging anyone! St. John's has allowed me to be flexible with my availability and I have always been able to commit to exactly what I am able to do - not more than.
