FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 9:51-62

"I will follow you Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God."



In today's gospel, Jesus had a conversation with several people about following Him. Jesus seemed rather harsh in his answers. "Let the dead bury the dead." This was his father who died, and Jesus basically told him to let it go. Jesus told the other that he might not be fit for the work if he felt that he needed to say good-bye to his family. I mean really: not even a few minutes to say goodbye? Something else must have been going on.

We can miss so much when we look behind instead of forward. We should be looking forward to the Kingdom of God, hungering for it more than anything else. Jesus even said that there is "nowhere for the Son of Man to rest his head." The mission work that Jesus had was fluid; there is simply no time to waste for insignificant things. That is because the mission is so important and valuable to bring to all who will listen.

While Jesus spoke in absolutes about the issues presented in the gospel, that didn't mean that those things weren't important. Of course, there is a need to bury a parent and a time to say goodbye to our family. Jesus is not without compassion; we know that from the stories we hear in the gospel repeatedly.

What might get lost in the gospel today is how James and John missed what their mission with Jesus was all about. They wanted to bring down fire from heaven because a Samaritan village would not welcome them there. Jesus was quick to remind them this was NOT what they were called to do. They simply moved to another village and continued their mission with Jesus.

So, the question we all must answer is: how fit are we for the kingdom of God? Are we quick to say "yes" to the Lord and then find one reason after another to say "no"? Do we have excuses ready for not being able to follow him at this moment? Perhaps we are good at lip service but when it comes to actually doing something for the building up of the kingdom, we turn away. Oh, we all seem to have valid reasons to step away from the call, but just how long will we fool ourselves? God sees the big picture; he knows where our hearts are. We can't spend our energy in the past or looking backwards in our lives. We need to live in the moment. The kingdom of God is NOW. We have been called by name to be a part of the kingdom. It is time to let the excuses fall away and put all our efforts into the Kingdom of God. When Jesus looks into our eyes and calls us by name, how will we respond? Before we answer, we better be willing to back up our response. Jesus is not interested in lip service. Action is what is called for in the kingdom construction.

The construction can be simply deepening our prayer lives. It might be getting more involved in our parish community. Even volunteering for the parish festival can be part of it. Yes, even in the simple act of giving a few hours to the parish family can help the kingdom grow. Find your way to say "yes" to the Lord Jesus and accept the call. Have a great week!

It must be at least 8 weeks since your last whole blood donation


You must be 17 or older (16 with parent consent form)

PSR Catechist Jody Gogins Shares How She Has Been Called

Like all parents, I struggle with time! It is hard to find the time to volunteer outside of the obligations at my children’s schools, my job, and other odds and ends. Being a catechist created an opportunity for me to serve St. John while also addressing the spiritual needs of my own children. I am a teacher, and I believe that we should use our gifts for good. Being a catechist allows me to use my skills in teaching, serve the Church, and have my children there as well.



I think some people are reluctant to become a catechist because they think they might not be a good teacher, or they might feel like they do not remember all that they once knew about the Church, the Bible, and its teachings. There is a sense of insecurity about having to teach children when one is not confident in her own knowledge. But - I would say that there is no pressure to be some sort of biblical scholar, or to be an expert on Catholicism. We are all practicing Catholics and have the foundation of our Church’s teachings. I have always felt very supported when being a catechist and have felt comfortable asking for help or clarification on content that I am not as confident in. No-one is judging anyone! St. John’s has allowed me to be flexible with my availability and I have always been able to commit to exactly what I am able to do - not more than.
