# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

JN 14:15-16, 23B-26

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."



We celebrate the feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church, on this Sunday. Today we remember that the Father did what Jesus said he would do: He sent the Holy Spirit. It gave the apostles the courage to do the mission that Jesus gave to them. They were no longer afraid; they were fearless because the Holy Spirit came to them in a powerful way. This was when the church, in its infant stage, began to speak to the known world in the one voice of Christ Crucified. The gift of the Holy Spirit was no longer locked away. Now, they opened the windows wide open and spoke the Good News of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection.

The Gospel takes us back to a time when Jesus was preparing them for this moment. Loving his apostles so much, Jesus did not want to leave them alone. His death was going to be something that would shake them to their cores. They were to keep Jesus's commandments and wait for another Advocate to come to them. This bond that Jesus had with his friends is one that brings the Trinity to them. It's comforting to hear these promises that Jesus gave to his apostles. In the midst of the great unknown, they were given the assurance that they would never be alone. Jesus basically told them that if they followed him and accepted his love, and if they love in return, they would be uniquely blessed.

With all this swimming in their heads, Jesus knew there was a limit to their comprehension. He had to give them the knowledge that there was one more gift he would place in their hearts. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father would make sure that they would never forget what Jesus taught them. They would have challenges in their mission, but the messages given from Jesus through the Holy Spirit would always keep them in line with their Lord and Savior. When the gift of the Holy Spirit came on that Pentecost morning, their lives would never be the same. They were empowered with the Good News and given the chance to spread it in the world. Jesus's promise of dwelling with them came true and he never left them alone. We have the same promise made to us. If we remain in Jesus's love and follow his commandments, the Holy Spirit will come to us and dwell within our hearts. The Spirit will teach us all that we need to know.

Pentecost reminds us that we are a church that continues to grow. We have a mission, like the apostles, to carry out the Good News to all those we encounter. The Holy Spirit will give us the courage to stand up and be heard. It is not enough to just speak the Good News; we need to live the Good News. That means we must be people who love Jesus and keep his words. We must not be passive in our faith. We need to be active and live our faith to the fullest. May this Pentecost remind each of us what it means to be a member of the Church. Each of us have been called by name to stand up and be present in the community. Let us be Christ for one another. Have a great week!



## PSR Catechist Lisa Letgers Shares How She Has Been Called

I was primarily motivated to start as a catechist when my children were younger. I wanted to serve as a role model of faith sharing. As the years progressed, I was inspired by the leaders of the parish school of religion program and the other catechists. I was continually reminded that making faith formation a priority was important to our family and the life of the church.



It sounds cliché, but this ministry truly is one in which you receive more blessings than you give - there is great reward from being with the young people of the parish. They spark the fire of faith in so many ways - their enthusiasm, questions, stories, joyfulness. And even with tweens and older teens - you get a glimmer of them seeking answers and sharing faith. They appreciate your efforts and show respectfulness. I have grown in confidence too and am more comfortable in expressing what my faith life means to me and my family. The time commitment is not as daunting as it may seem to a busy person - I always felt supported by the church staff and fellow catechists. The flow of ideas and sharing of materials makes planning for class a manageable part of our routines. The weekly class became something I looked forward to and loved sharing with the students. I will say, having a mighty awesome co-catechist was the icing on the cake. Perhaps more people would consider this option - if they could share the load per se. And finally, it is a great way to stay connected and feel part of the larger church community.
