# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 10:25-37

"But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?'... "Which of these, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."



Most of us probably know the story of the Good Samaritan by heart. A Jew is robbed and beaten on the road. The people who should have helped him instead ignored him, and the last person to care about a Jew, a Samaritan, stops and cares for his wounds. The scholar of the law who thought he would test Jesus was taken to school by the Master. The priest and the Levite passed him. Each, of course, had their reasons for doing so, or at least that's how the story goes. However, the Samaritan had something the other two did not have: compassion. The man that Jesus labels as "hero" had compassion for his fellow man. It did not matter to him who he was or what he was; all he saw was a person who needed care.

The lawyer was set up. He could have walked away from the conversation with his answer, but he wanted to justify himself. I mean, how many times have we been in a position where we needed to "justify ourselves" to make ourselves look better in front of people? The lawyer knew the two Great Commandments. He knew how to give the textbook answer, but it was not enough. Jesus said he had to go out and live the Commandments. With Jesus' story, now he knew what was missing in his answer: treating people with compassion and mercy. It sounds great, but I suspect not as easy as he thought his original answer was.

We all love to have mercy and compassion offered to us. Most of us love to be taken care of when things aren't going our way. Many of us would do show mercy and compassion to a friend or a family member when the time calls for it. But what about when we are too busy? You may think, I am sure someone else will come along and take care of things. The person needing compassion and mercy might even be someone with whom you don't get along. What if there was a real hate for that person? How does that mercy and compassion look now?

Jesus challenges us to see everyone as our neighbor. It isn't just about those we care about or "like". It's not so easy. But when people reach out to me, it teaches me that I must also do the same to others. Once there is a pattern of mercy and compassion, it can grow from the limited view of family and friends. It can grow to our faith community and the community at large.

If we all see ourselves as a part of the Body of Christ, then strangers are never really strangers, for we are all part of the same family. When we attempt to put our differences aside and see people for who they are, children of God, then our approach to reaching out can be possible. We may not be successful all the time, but we must work on moving out of our comfort zones. Christ died for all of us and because of that, we need to work on seeing all as neighbors. Jesus teaches us how to live; now we must embrace that Good News. Have a great week!
