FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 10:1-12, 17-20

"...Whatever town you enter, and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter, and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: "The Kingdom of God is at hand."



Jesus sent out 72 "others" to places that he intended to visit. He told them they were like lambs sent among wolves; they were to depend on the word of God and the hospitality of the towns they entered. Their mission was to reveal that the Kingdom of God was at hand. They were also given the power to cure the sick. They gave a spirit of peace to those who accepted their message. However, there were some who would not accept this message of hospitality; these people received a stern warning. The Kingdom of God was still at hand, and they would be judged by their lack of faith.

As the gospel goes on, we hear that the 72 were rejoicing at their success. They had power of demons because they were subject to Jesus' name. They were a hit, successful in their mission. We hear of no one place rejecting them. The Good News was the focus and the kingdom of God was alive and well among the people. The ground-work for Jesus was now set; the kingdom could come alive for all.

Those who did the bidding of the Master would have their names written in heaven. They started the work and would continue to learn from Jesus about the Kingdom of God and how they would continue to be a part of that kingdom. But the call remains today. The harvest is abundant, and laborers are few. Who will respond to the call of the Master? We all have been called by the Master to do his work. He has called each of us by name for a specific role in the building up of the Kingdom of God. We are part of the Body of Christ and as such, we have a responsibility to continue to labor in the fields. We are well-equipped with all the tools we need to be successful. Our mission is the same as the 72: to announce that the Kingdom of God is at hand. But we must also have the spirit of hospitality toward others. We are to recognize the kingdom among us. We do not want to be a person who refuses to accept the kingdom invitation. Imagine if we let that opportunity slip through our fingers simply because we did not recognize a disciple of Jesus.

We are called to be a part of the Body of Christ and to see others as our equals. We are called to work together, building up the Kingdom. We can't simply wait for someone else to do the work. We have each been graced by the Son to be proclaimers of the Good News. The work is never finished; there is always more work to be completed. Don't let the Lord see you sitting idle as others labor in the fields. We are called to be active in the kingdom. If we remain faithful in the work, we are called to do we too will find our names written in heaven and that will indeed be a reason for rejoicing. Have a great week!


