FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 13:22-30

"Someone asked him, 'Lord, will only a few people be saved?' He answered them, 'Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then you will stand outside knocking and saying 'Lord, open the door for us.' He will say to you in reply, 'I do not know where you are from.'"



Who will be saved? Jesus made his way to Jerusalem where his mission would be complete. He fixed in on one thing only: the cross that would lead to salvation for all. Jesus spoke about the narrow gate. The implication is that the journey was not easy. The journey would call for a change of heart. It would call for true sacrifice and letting go of obstacles to a right relationship with Jesus.

Who will be saved? When we knock on the door, will Jesus know us, or will we hear, "I do not know where you are from"? It is not enough to observe. There must be an effort. We need to be an active part of the body of Christ. If we want the door to be open for us, we need to make sure Jesus knows us by our deeds. How do we reflect what Jesus has taught us in our daily lives? Do people see that our hearts are full of the good news? Lip service is never enough; there has to be an action plan.

Who will be saved? The question remains for each of us. When it comes to that final call, will we be ready to be recognized by the Lord? How do our hearts look? Do we still have our own agenda and not the Lord's? Salvation is not just a "me and God" relationship; it is more universal. For us to be a part of the master's plan, we have to be fully engaged and other-centered. We can only reach salvation by allowing Jesus into our lives. Of course, the best way to do that is through the Eucharist. It gives us food for the journey and strengthens us to be strong in spreading the Good News. It is essential to be fortified in the Lord. When we strive to become what we receive, in the Eucharist, then we are Christ-centered, alive in the Body of Christ.

Who will be saved? Anyone who walks with Jesus to Jerusalem will be saved. When we see the Good News as our news, then we finally understand what it means to embrace the will of the Father. Jesus shows us the way to embrace that. It comes with a price, but the reward is well worth the sacrifice. We don't want to get to the door and knock and have the Master turn us away. How painful it would be to have Jesus not recognize us. How sad to be rejected for all eternity because we failed to be recognized as a child of God. It doesn't have to be that way. It is not too late to be recognized by Jesus. Invite him into your heart. Allow him to give you nourishment in the Eucharist. Find ways to be Christ for others. They can be simple things. What a freeing experience, to be Christ for others.

So, who will be saved? You and I can be when we follow Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. Do something to make a difference in the world around you. Don't get left out! Be an active part of the Body of Christ. You won't be disappointed. Have a great week!


