

# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 15:1-32

"Coming to his senses he thought, How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here I am, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called you son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.'"



The younger son came to his senses, but wasn't it a bit too late? After all, he basically dishonored his Father, his religion, and his country in one sweeping action. He got his inheritance and ran through it, finding himself empty, alone, and hungry. So, the motivation for returning home to the Father's house was HUNGER. He really didn't feel a deep sense of sorrow, although he did say he wasn't worthy to be called his son anymore.

The younger son knew his father was a just man. He assumed that his Father's compassion would allow him to be a hired hand. His logic was that he would have to earn the food he would receive by being a hired hand. But this was no ordinary father. He caught sight of the younger son while he was still a long way off. The son was ready to give his speech, but it may not have been necessary. The younger son was home and the father rejoiced at the sight of him. It was time for a party for what was lost. What had been dead was alive and in the loving embrace of the father. The parables today are spoken to the Pharisees and scribes to teach them about the compassion of the Father. The Pharisees and scribes were blind to the compassion that God has for his children, especially those who need forgiveness and a path back home. The father in the parable broke all the rules and showed how merciful we are truly called to be. What an amazing God we have: slow to anger and rich in compassion. We are blessed with a God who is willing to go out to meet us where we are. All it takes is for us to turn back and make the move towards Him. The important thing to realize is that we need the Father, for we are sinners. We are broken souls in need of the compassionate Father to heal us. It is the gift of humility that allows us to fall into the loving arms of the Father. When we do, the celebration begins and there is great rejoicing in the kingdom when we come back into the graces of the Father.

We are the tax collectors and sinners that Jesus was talking to in the gospel today. Or are we? Could we be like the Pharisees and scribes, looking down our noses at those who we judge unworthy? Perhaps we like to play the role of judges so that we don't have to look at ourselves too closely. We just might be the older son in the story, refusing to allow the younger son a second chance. We might be refusing to celebrate his return home to the Father. You know, we might ask who is really lost and dead in the story. Yes, the younger son did some amazingly stupid things, but he came home hungry to be fed by the Father. The older son stood his ground because he felt he was owed a favor for being a good son. His ego would not allow him to see beyond his own selfish life. Humility is such a wonderful gift and we need to use it more in our lives.

No matter what is going on in your life, it is never too late to turn around and reach out to the Father. Whatever you are hungry for, he has what it takes to satisfy that hunger. Don't let your ego get in the way. When we think we are in charge, that is when the distance grows. Trust in the compassion of the Father. While you are at it, try to use some of that compassion on your neighbors around you. Have a great week!


