# FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 14:1, 7-14

"When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the Resurrection of the righteous."

A meal with one of the leading Pharisees opened the door for Jesus to speak about several things. Meals were a great part of Jesus' ministry. He taught many valuable lessons to the people who were in the midst of the story. First, Jesus taught about places of honor and how one must be humble. It never hurts to be humble. It can teach us to be other-centered and not self-centered.

The second lesson that Jesus taught may cause one to reflect more. Jesus offered a challenge to the Pharisee about just who should be invited to a meal. It is easy to invite people that will someday invite you back in return. It is fun to have a circle of friends and family that gather for fellowship. But Jesus gave us a different set of people to invite to the banquet. They were probably the least likely people you would ever think to invite to your banquet.

Luke was all about the social outcast. In Luke, Jesus spoke about the people on the fringe of society. They were people that could get lost in the greater scheme of things. They were people that most would simply walk past, not giving them a second thought. But Jesus, in Luke's gospel, brought them up close and personal. You can't help but notice them because Jesus made them center stage in this gospel. To some people, this might make them nervous. Surely, Jesus is not asking us to invite "these" people into our homes? Well, Jesus may not be asking us to bring them into our homes, but we are called to welcome them and reach out to them.

We do a lot around the parish to reach out to others. There are certain times of the year we shine brighter than others. Is that enough? Is there more we can do for others in our community? I think there is; there is always more we can do for those who need a hand in their lives. Our Generations of Faith is coming up in early October. It is a time where we reach out to agencies that need our help. We also need help with supplies for the two nights of service. In the past, you have stepped up and made the nights flow very smoothly. We need your help again. Go online, check the bulletin, and see what kinds of items we need to help the groups that have pledged to help. It is up to you to make these nights a success. These are the people we can help without worrying if we will be repaid. Their inability to repay is grace enough for each of you. Please consider lending a helping hand with getting all the supplies we need and then joining us for one of the evenings of service. You will be repaid at the Resurrection of the righteous.

Jesus has offered each of us a challenge; how will you respond? It is easy to do things for those who return the favor. But the when we reach beyond our comfort zones to those who don't fit into our little worlds, then the world we live in suddenly expands. When the world we live in grows to include all of the Body of Christ, then we have embraced the Gospel Jesus has given us. Have a great week!




