FATHER DON'S REFLECTION

LK 16:1-13

"No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Jesus told a story about a steward who was squandering a rich man's property. He was told to give an account of his work. He knew that he had been caught. He wanted to save himself any way that he could. "And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently."

"If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth?" Mammon is that kind of wealth. It is something that can seem so alluring and so tempting. This is what got the steward in trouble. His eyes grew greedy and he continued to take things that did not belong to him.

There is a spirit of trust that Jesus speaks about as well. One who is trustworthy in small matters will do the same with larger things. And of course, the reverse is true as well; one who is dishonest in small things will do the same with great ones too. All of this leads to important life choices. Who are you going to serve? Jesus told us that it comes down to two: God or mammon.

We all must survive in the material world. But that does not mean we can ignore the God who is giver of all good things. It is impossible to serve both God and the material world. While they both can appear attractive, the material world will and does let us down.

The material world can be so seductive. It can pull us into a habit of worshipping things rather than God. While we may pay lip-service to God, we lose the real connection when we put these obstacles in front of us. Our life suddenly does not belong to God anymore; we have managed to put our stock in the world that will end and will disappoint. Suddenly, church is not as important. Our prayer lives take a full-time vacation. We drift further and further from the real God who saves. The material world may give pleasure, but it will disappoint us in so many ways. When the Lord comes and is looking for accountability of life, what will we have to offer him? We can show him all the toys we have collected but that won't impress him at all. He will investigate our hearts to see what is there. But alas, if he sees that the material world became our God, the Lord will see a heart that has grown cold.

We need to serve the master who gives us life: God. He is the source of all goodness. He is the pathway to the kingdom of heaven where we all long to be. We do need to survive in the material world, but it is not our god that saves us. We need to remove the obstacles in our lives that keep us from a right relationship with God. Get the stuff out of the way so that God can touch your heart and make it whole once again. It is time to choose the right Master, the one that we must be devoted to. We don't need to absolutely despise the wealth in the world; it just shouldn't be the center of our lives. It is a master that will let us down repeatedly. Serve the Lord with all your heart, mind and soul. Survive in the material world and long for the Kingdom that never ends. Put your trust in God and he will never disappoint. Have a great week!


St. John Youth Choir
